Vaccinate to Congregate

Steubenville, OH - In an effort to increase Covid-19 vaccine access to the underserved residents of Steubenville, the Jefferson County General Health District will hold vaccine clinics at area churches throughout the month of June. All are welcome and no appointment is necessary.

The Vaccinate to Congregate initiative was developed by the newly hired RADx-UP Community Health Workers. RADx-UP stands for Rapid Acceleration of Diagnostics in Underserved Populations. The goal of RADx-UP is to address and reduce the disparities in COVID-19 education, testing, contact tracing, vaccines, follow-up and treatment among minority, underserved, vulnerable populations (MUVPs).
